A Letter from Rabbi Bigman

As you know, this month we celebrate *Pesach*. The opening chapters of the Book of Exodus tell the story of how we were slaves in Egypt and were eventually set free. We then are commanded by God through Moses to

"Remember this day, on which you went free from Egypt, the house of bondage, how God freed you from it with a mighty hand: no leavened bread shall be eaten. You go free on this day, in the month of *Aviv*. So, when God has brought you into the land of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites, which was sworn to your fathers to be given you, a land flowing with milk and honey, you shall observe in this month the following practice: Seven days you shall eat unleavened bread, and on the seventh day there shall be a festival of God. Throughout the seven days unleavened bread shall be eaten; no leavened bread shall be found with you, and no leaven shall be found in all your territory. And you shall explain to your child on that day, 'It is because of what God did for me when I went free from Egypt.' And this shall serve you as a sign on your hand and as a reminder on your forehead -- in order that God's Teaching may be in your mouth -- that with a mighty hand God freed you from Egypt. You shall keep this institution at its set time from year to year. [Exodus 13:3-10]

Here we learn about not eating leavened bread, the length of this festival, and the custom of teaching our children. Later, in the Book of Leviticus, all of the *Torah* holidays are listed in a calendar of sorts. Here we find the commandment of *Sefirat HaOmer* (Counting the *Omer*): "'And from the day [the second day of *Pesach*] on which you bring the *omer* offering...you shall count off seven weeks. They must be complete: you must count until the day after the seventh week -- fifty days; then you shall bring an offering of new grain to the Lord.'" [Lev. 23:15-16]

So we count from the second day of *Pesach* to *Shavuot* linking our physical redemption (*Pesach*) to our spiritual redemption (*Shavuot*).

Rabbi Sharon Cohen Anisfeld taught "the Exodus teaches us that the journey from here to there has to happen one step at a time. We enact this truth in our ritual counting of the *Omer*. We count each day and bless the act of counting -- but we are careful never to mention the next day's count. The progression from one day to the next is not to be taken for granted. We count only the time we have been given; we look toward Sinai, but we thank God for the present moment." ["We Who are the Gardeners are Also the Garden," hebrewcollege.edu, April 12, 2018]

As you celebrate *Pesach* and count the days until *Shavuot*, I pray that you will remember that each day is a gift and not take it for granted. *Chag Sameakh!*

Shaarey Zedek Religious School (SZRS) maintains a strong focus on safety and security. Over the last several years, safety features have been added to the classrooms, and the security grant upgrades will make the classrooms more secure. An armed guard is present when school is in session. We are planning first aid training for the staff.

PRESIDENT'S CORNER

A key concept developed in sociologist Erving Goffman's classic text, The Presentation of Self in Everyday Life, is "frontstage" vs. "backstage" behavior. Frontstage behavior involves intentional and strategic "performance" of a particular role for a specific audience. An example is a *Shabbat* service in which congregants, clergy, and others enact behaviors that meet community expectations.

Backstage, on the other hand, involves more relaxed and informal behavior. An example is simply spending time with family and/or close friends, a context in which we often feel more like our authentic selves and worry less about others' perceptions. Frontstage is eating a delicious meal in a restaurant, and backstage is what happens in the kitchen. Frontstage involves acting a certain way, while backstage behavior is transparent.

Since becoming President of Congregation Shaarey Zedek in July, I have been committed to transparency—backstage behavior--by communicating with the congregation frequently in this monthly column, via email messages, and from the *bimah*. Likewise, Business Vice President John Anthony has communicated about the financial health of our congregation both in person and through the Monthly Bulletin. In this vein, I want to make you aware of our budgetary challenges. Like all small nonprofit organizations, we struggle to balance our budget, especially in light of rising costs and losing members to death or relocation.

Our budget is not an abstraction but a concrete reality. Last month, our utility bill was over \$5,000. This cost is not sustainable without increased revenue. The Matching Campaign that our Fundraising Committee has been facilitating is ongoing. As I have previously noted, we are extremely fortunate to have a small group of generous donors who have challenged the congregation at large to match their collective \$100,000 donation. And we are deeply grateful to those who have already stepped up to meet this challenge. The problem is that many congregants have not yet donated. Please remember that any amount helps and give what you can. If everyone gives even a small amount, we can meet our budgetary challenges. Your donations help fund the events you love attending as well as the ongoing needs of our synagogue. Be assured that John, the Board, and I are working assiduously to find new revenue streams and are committed to presenting a balanced budget to the congregation. Please help our community continue to thrive!

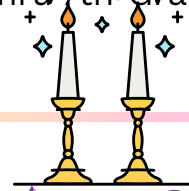

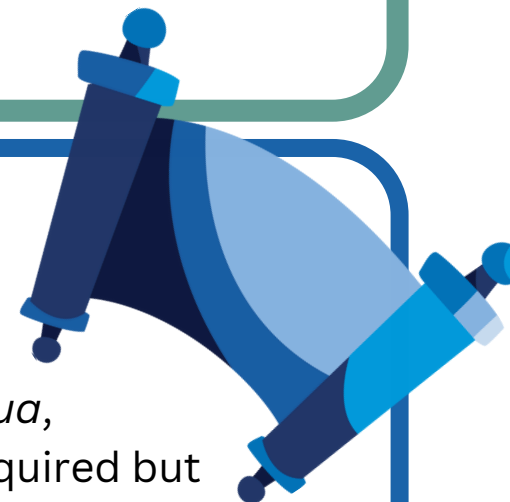
WEEKLY TORAH STUDY
