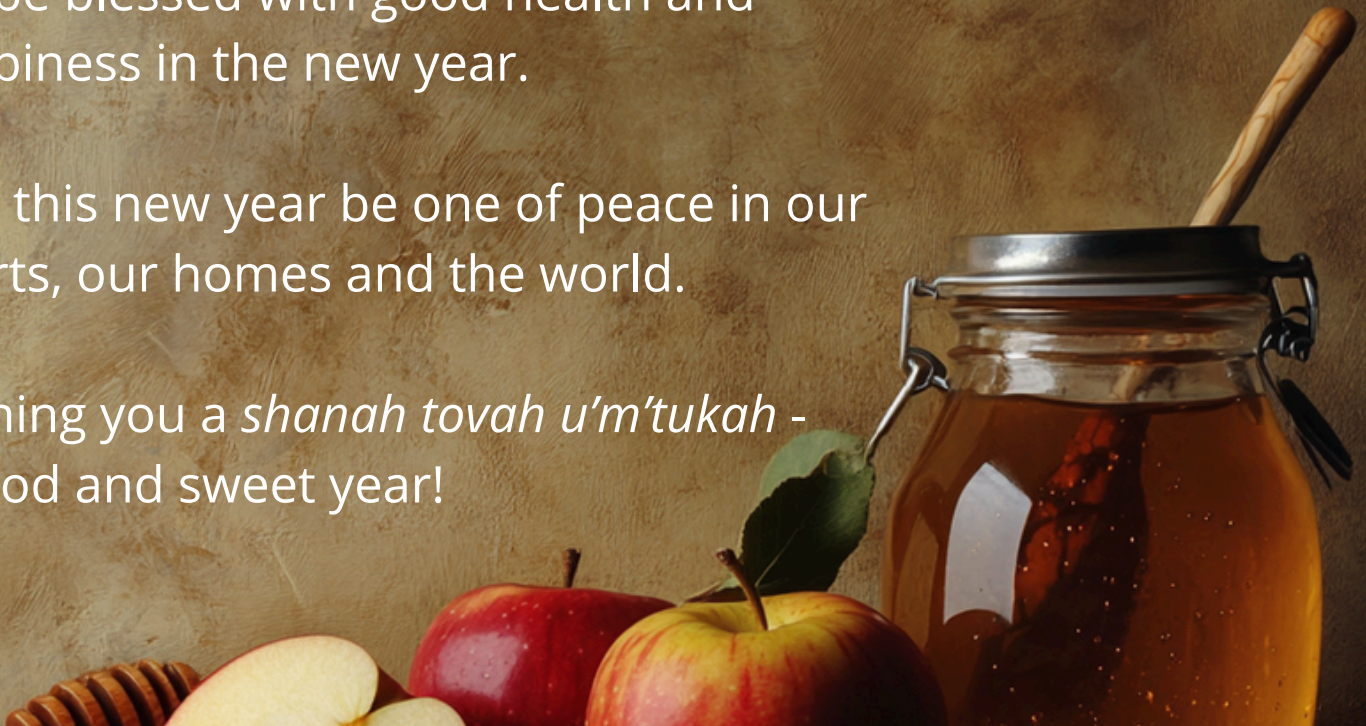

A Letter from Rabbi Bigman

The first *Shabbat* of the Jewish year is called *Shabbat Shuvah* (the Sabbath of Return). Its name comes from the *Haftarah* which opens with the word "*shuvah*":

שׁוּבָה יִשְׂרָאֵל עַד יְהוָה אֱלֹהֶיךָ כִּי כָשַׁלְתָּ בְּעֹנֶךָ:

Return, O Israel, to Adonai your God, for you have fallen because of your sin. [Hosea 14:2]

The *Haftarah* highlights themes of penitence and human reconciliation with God, appropriate for the *Shabbat* between *Rosh Hashanah* and *Yom Kippur*. This year *Shabbat Shuvah* begins at sundown on Friday, September 26.

The *Torah* portion for *Shabbat Shuvah* this year is *Vayeilech* (Deuteronomy 31:1-30). In this *parashah* we learn of the importance of writing a *Torah* scroll; the Rabbis understood this also to mean that each of us is obligated to learn *Torah*.

In his commentary on this *parashah*, "Why My Non-Jewish Taxi Driver Respects Judaism: Judaism's Unique Approach to Education," Rabbi Dr. Elliot Dorff, the rector and Sol and Anne Dorff Distinguished Service Professor of Philosophy at American Jewish University and visiting professor at UCLA School of Law, teaches about the importance of learning *Torah*. He notes that "while Jews take it for granted that everyone is entitled -- indeed, commanded -- to learn the tradition, this was not at all the practice in the ancient world. Most religions were esoteric; that is, only the priest or other elite members of the society were made privy to the secret beliefs and practices of the religion."

The *Torah* shows God telling Moses to "speak to the Children of Israel," not just to the leaders of the people, but to all people. Rabbi Dr. Dorff cites Columbia University scholar E. J. Bickerman ([Studies in Jewish and Christian History](#) [Leiden: Brill, 1976], Part 1, p. 199), who notes that found in the archaeological remains of the Syrian city of Dura "in the Mithra temple at Dura [there] is a Magian in his sacred dress who keeps the sacred scroll closed in his hand. [But] in the synagogue of Dura, a layman, without any sign of office, is represented reading the open scroll."

This *parashah* tells us that everyone is to learn the *Torah*'s teachings: "Gather the people -- men, women, children, and the strangers in your communities -- that they may hear and so learn to revere the Lord your God and to observe faithfully every word of this Teaching." [Deut. 31:12]

Please learn with us this year! As you read through this and subsequent bulletins, you will find many adult learning opportunities. If you have ideas for courses, please reach out to us so that we know what is of interest to you. Always remember: It is never too late to learn!

Wishing you, your loved ones, and the entire world a happy, healthy, and peaceful new year! *Shanah Tovah!*

PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Last year, in my High Holy Days address, I suggested that we all “get comfortable with being uncomfortable,” and one of the best ways to do this is to approach change as an opportunity rather than an obstacle. Instead of fearing change, we can embrace it, knowing that by changing, we continue to grow and to learn. Our congregation is poised on the brink of major change, and although it can feel frightening to move from the familiar to the unknown, we must remember that the people and practices we know and love were once new to us. Change is inevitable. Change can be challenging. And change is vital to our congregational wellbeing.

As you know, Rabbi Bigman has announced that she will retire June 30, 2027, at which point she will have served our congregation for twenty years. Her retirement will be a momentous change for our congregation as we move forward into an unknown future. We are fortunate to have the next two years as a period of discernment as we determine collectively not only what we are seeking in our next rabbi, but also how we can ensure that our budget aligns with our goals. To this end, over the next few months, I will be appointing both a rabbinic search committee and a transition team. We will post the position in June of 2026, and the new administration (elected at our May 2026 annual meeting) will facilitate the search process.

How can you be involved? The board and I will be holding listening sessions in October and November, so please read your monthly bulletins and weekly newsletters for details. Your input is critical; if you are unable to attend one of the listening sessions and would like to share your suggestions/questions, please contact me via email (gilbert@alma.edu) or phone (989-285-5918) at any time. With your help, I know that as a congregational family, we will change together and continue to flourish.

I look forward to seeing you during the High Holy Days and wish you and your families *L'Shanah Tovah!*

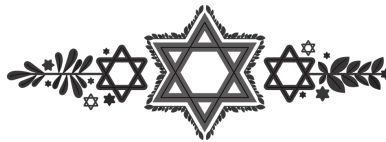
