A Letter from Rabbi Bigman

This year *Chanukah* begins on the evening of Sunday, December 14. On *Shabbat Chanukah* (Friday, December 19), we will worship together at 6 p.m. with our *Gan*, *Alef*, and *Bet* students leading us in song and in singing the candle blessings at the beginning of our worship that evening. Please bring your *chanukiah* and candles to light during worship.

In 2007, as part of an initiative to address the growing problem of poverty in the general and Jewish communities, the Union for Reform Judaism, the Jewish Council for Public Affairs, and the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism created the *Ner Shel Tzedakah* (Light of Righteous Giving) program to raise public awareness and educate the Jewish community about poverty during the *Chanukah* season. It is planned each year for the sixth night of *Chanukah*.

This year the sixth night falls on December 19. Please consider bringing gifts for the Greater Lansing Food Bank with you to worship that evening and/or sending a donation to your favorite social justice organization. (You may wish to consider Shaarey Zedek's Rabbi Morton and Aviva Hoffman *Tzedakah* Fund or *MAZON*: A Jewish Response to Hunger for your donation.)

CHANUKAH BLESSINGS

Ner Shel Tzedakah (Candle / Light of Righteous Giving)

As part of an initiative to address the problem of poverty in the general and Jewish communities, the Union for Reform Judaism, the Jewish Council for Public Affairs, and the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism created this program to raise public awareness and educate the Jewish community about poverty during the *Chanukah* season. It is planned each year for the sixth night of *Chanukah* and the first one was held in 2007.

On the 6th night of *Chanukah*, families are encouraged to teach their children about the needs of those less fortunate and donate the value of the gifts they would ordinarily exchange (or the gifts themselves) to local or national organizations assisting the poor. The process of deciding where and how to fulfill this *mitzvah* can itself be a fun and engaging family project.
