RABBI BIGMAN'S LETTER

HELPING OTHERS DURING A GLOBAL PANDEMIC

During this time of staying home in order to help our community to stay healthy, I have been trying to find organizations that I can support that are doing important work in our local and larger communities. For those of you financially able to do so, I suggest the following:

- <u>Congregation Shaarey Zedek</u> -- During this difficult time, the staff is doing its utmost to help members of our congregation and community. From live-streaming our *Shabbat* services to continued contact with our religious school families, providing *Pesach* resources and links to education and social justice opportunities, to the community interfaith Worship Service of Hope (https://www.youtube.com/watch? v=RTZDYGj59dQ) to working with upcoming *B'nei Mitzvah* families and more, we are here for you. Jewish tradition teaches that we are to help others, beginning with family and then continuing with our larger communities.
- **MAZON:** A Jewish Response to Hunger (www.mazon.org) provides funding to a range of anti-hunger organizations including food banks, legal-service organizations, groups which provide job skills to enable people to get jobs to provide for their families on their own, and more.
- <u>Greater Lansing Food Bank</u> (www.greaterlansingfoodbank.org) provides food for people in the seven counties of Ingham, Eaton, Clinton, Shiawassee, Gratiot, Clare, and Isabella.

Also, I have found two local organizations that are helping in unique ways:

- Hotels for Heroes (https://www.gofundme.com/f/hotelsforheros) was created by Cindy Hughey and Robyn Hughey of MSU Hillel. They write: "Help us house our Greater Lansing hometown heroes who are on the front lines battling the COVID-19 pandemic. All funds raised will directly benefit emergency responders and health care workers who are looking for alternative housing to keep their families and loved ones safe. We are working directly with Hampton Inn & Suites in Delta Township, Homewood Suites in Eastwood Towne Center, and the Kellogg Hotel & Conference Center at Michigan State University to cover the hotel room costs directly." [Please note that the GoFundMe page omits the second "e" in "heroes" on its site.]
- <u>3D Printing Masks & Shields for Lansing Hospitals</u> (https://www.gofundme.com/f/3d-printing-n95-masks -for-lansing-hospitals) -- In conjunction with East Lansing Public Schools, tinkrLAB is making masks and shields that are donated locally.

Our *Tzedakah* Committee, using funds donated by members to our Rabbi Morton and Aviva Hoffman *Tzedakah* Fund, are continuing to support many organizations, including the Greater Lansing Food Bank and these local organizations:

Fostering Academics, Mentoring Excellence (www.fame.socialwork.msu.edu) notes on its website: "The national coronavirus crisis is greatly impacting MSU students. As the University has moved all classes online, some students have gone home to continue remote learning, or to practice social distancing. However, for some, MSU's campus is their home. Our FAME students are former foster youth, homeless, or are otherwise independent. This public health crisis has eliminated jobs these students dependent on to meet their basic needs."

<u>Child and Family Charities</u> (www.childandfamily.org) was to be the recipient of the *Tzedakah* Committee's April Fill-A-Bucket Campaign, to benefit its Housing Young Families Program. Child and Family Charities offers a full-spectrum of support to over 7,000 children, youth, and families each year in the mid-Michigan area. Its primary mission is "to strengthen and support children, families, and individuals as they evolve and grow in a changing community." Among its many programs is the aforementioned Housing Young Families Program, 24-Hour Crisis Hotline, Higher Ground (prevention and emergency shelter services), Crossroads Transitional Living Program, and T.R.U.E. (Teens Understanding and Respecting Each-other; LGBTQ Support Group).

Also, the <u>American Red Cross</u> (www.redcrossblood.org) is holding blood drives throughout the country. Please join me in signing up for a time to donate. (I had to wait two weeks for an open spot, but it is worth it!)

These organizations are just a few of the many that are doing important work right now. If you are able to do so, I hope you will support one or more of these organizations or others of which you are aware that are doing the work of *tikkun olam* (repairing the world).

*If you are in need of help, please contact me confidentially. We do have some funds in the Rabbinic Discretionary Fund and in the *Tzedakah* Fund that can help you at this time.


