Rabbi Bigman's *D'var Torah* from our annual congregational meeting on June 12:

At the beginning of this week's *Torah* portion, *B'ha'alot'kha*, the third *Torah* portion in the Book of Numbers, God "spoke to Moses, saying: 'Make you two silver trumpets, hammered work you shall make them; and they shall serve you for calling the community and for the journeying of the camps.'" [Numbers 10:1-2, Alter translation]

The Rabbis note that the Hebrew says "עֲשֵׂה לְּךְּ שְׁתֵּי חֲצוֹצְרָת -- make **yourself** two silver trumpets." Why is the reflexive לְּרִ 'cha (yourself) included here? What does it mean to make yourself a trumpet?

Rabbi Dr. Bradley Shavit Artson, Dean of the Ziegler School of Rabbinic Studies at the American Jewish University, one of the Conservative Movement's seminaries, notes that

A beautiful trumpet, even in the midst of producing music, doesn't draw attention to itself. It is the music it produces, not the horn, which people focus on. So too, say the sages, by making ourselves trumpets we focus attention on the God in whose service we delight. Our music is the sacred deeds we perform...

They illustrate that point with a charming *midrash* about King Solomon: as he was bringing the Ark into the newly-built Temple, he sang to the gates of Jerusalem: '[S'u sh'arim rasheikhem] O gates, lift up your heads... [v'yavo melekh ha-kavod] so the king of glory may come in!' The doors, thinking that Solomon was referring to himself, were appalled by his arrogance. At once they 'threatened to sink down on him and crush his head.' They asked, '[Mi hu zeh melekh ha-kavod?] Who is the king of glory?' and, fortunately for him, Solomon answered, 'Adonai Tz'va'ot hu melekh ha-kavod! The Lord of hosts is the King of glory.' The midrash tells us that thereupon they paid God honor and lifted themselves up, and the ark entered.

Solomon was as wise, as rich, and as powerful a Jew as has ever lived. Yet he knew that the credit for his wisdom did not lie with himself. He was but a trumpet in the hands of a master musician... [Rabbi Bradley Shavit Artson, "Make Yourself a Trumpet, Toot Your Own Horn," *Parashat Be'halot'cha*, 16 *Sivan* 5764 / 21 *Sivan* 5769, www.aju.edu]

Today as we do the business of this congregation, let us be mindful that this is holy business. We sit in God's sanctuary, making decisions for the future of God's people, Congregation Shaarey Zedek's members. To that end, let us remember that we are God's trumpets, serving God's people, each of whom is made *b'tzelem Elohim* -- in God's image.

As we say together: Amen.

Erev Rosh HaShanah, Sunday, September 25: sit on *bimah* (up to 4 people), light candles, English reading prior to the *Kiddush*, open the Ark for the singing of *Avinu Malkeinu*, open the Ark for the chanting of *Aleinu*

Rosh HaShanah, Monday, September 26: sit on bimah (up to 4 people), hakafah (carry the Torah scroll around the sanctuary before the reading), aliyot (5 people or couples), hagbahah (lifting the Torah scroll), g'lilah (dressing the Torah scroll)

Rosh HaShanah, Tuesday, September 27: sit on bimah (up to 4 people), hakafah (two people to carry the Torah scrolls around the sanctuary before and after the reading), aliyot (5 people or couples), hagbahah (two people to lift the two Torah scrolls), g'lilah (two people to dress the two Torah scrolls)

Kol Nidrei, Tuesday, October 4: our current and past presidents will participate in worship this evening

Yom Kippur, Wednesday, October 5:

Morning Worship: sit on *bimah* (up to 4 people), *hakafah* (carry the *Torah* scroll around the sanctuary before the reading), *aliyot* (5 people or couples), *hagbahah* (lifting the *Torah* scroll), *g'lilah* (dressing the *Torah* scroll)

Afternoon (*Minkhah*) Worship: sit on *bimah* (up to 4 people), *aliyot* (3 people or couples), *hagbahah* (lifting the *Torah* scroll), *g'lilah* (dressing the *Torah* scroll)

Concluding (Ne'ilah) Worship: sit on bimah (up to 4 people), open the Ark at the conclusion of worship



About five years ago, Dror Israel developed a unique guided mobile exhibit and accompanying educational session telling this amazing story, which has been run at schools, after–school programs, various educational workshops, at Sigd holiday celebrations, and more. After the controversies and clashes of recent years between the police and the Ethiopian–Israeli community, Dror Israel began developing a program together with the Israel Police using the mobile exhibit as a base, with the goal of improving relations between the community and law enforcement, helping police officers see community members in a different light, and addressing prejudices and racism.
