a Letter from Rabbi Bigman

On the final *Shabbat* in May, the *Torah* portion was the final one in the Book of Leviticus. There is an Ashkenazic tradition that, after reading the last portion of each of the books of the *Torah*, those present state: "*chazak*, *chazak*, *v'nitchazek* – be strong, be strong, and may we be strengthened." (Translations of this phrase also include "be strong, be strong, and let us summon our strength" or "be strong, be strong, and let us strengthen one another.")

Whenever I show a *Torah* scroll to the many visiting groups who join us for worship or tours each year, they are amazed to see that the scroll has no markings showing us chapter and verse. There is, however, a significant amount of space in the *Torah* scroll between the end of one book of the Torah and the beginning of the next book. Unlike our *chumashim* (*Torah* commentaries) or our English translations of the Bible, which cite the chapter and verse at the top of each page, the *Torah* scroll only notes the end of one book and the beginning of the next through these blank spaces.

In her commentary, Rabbi Sharyn Henry, of Rodef Shalom Congregation of Pittsburgh, notes that

The white space at the end of one book of *Torah* and the beginning of another is a moment of transition. By reciting the words, *Chazak* – be strong – we remind ourselves that *Torah* is always with us. In times of transition, especially, *Torah* and Jewish tradition give us strength.

The last phrase of the formula – v'nitchazek, may we be strengthened – is of critical importance. We are important sources of strength for one another in times of uncertainty and transition.

As we move from one book of *Torah* to another, as we move into and out of spaces of uncertainty and transition, may we always recall the charge chazak, chazak, v'nitchazek. Our tradition makes us strong, and we make one another stronger.

We strengthen one another when we support our religious school children who read the *Megillah* for our congregation on the Wednesday closest to *Purim*, when we attend worship services which our *B'nei Mitzvah* help to lead, when we attend Confirmation and Graduation for our high school students, when we attend social and educational events, when we reach out to our fellow congregants when we learn of a death in their family, when we contribute financially to our congregation to the best of our ability, when we support our *B'nei Mitzvah* students' *mitzvah* projects and our *Tzedakah* Committee's collections for the community, when we serve on committees or on the Temple or Sisterhood boards, when we attend our congregation's annual meeting and more.

We get so much from participation as we strengthen ourselves, our temple family, and our community. Chazak, chazak, v'nitchazek!




