A Letter from Rabbi Bigman

WELCOME, CANTOR RICHARD (RICK) LAWRENCE!

I am pleased to share with you that **Cantor Richard (Rick) Lawrence** will be joining us for the High Holy Days this year! Cantor Lawrence will be coming to us from across the ocean as he is living in Gaborone, Botswana for two years serving as a chaplain for Princess Marina Hospital. Although he will be traveling over 8,000 miles to be with us, Cantor Lawrence has a much closer connection to our community: He was raised in Ann Arbor where he still has family and where his love of singing and playing piano began. We look forward to welcoming him and his family for the High Holy Days this year.

Cantor Lawrence earned his B.A. in Jewish Studies at Oberlin College, a certificate in Elementary Education from Eastern Michigan University, and a Masters of Jewish Education and Cantorial Ordination from Hebrew College. Since his ordination in 2014, Cantor Lawrence has served as the cantor of Temple Emanu-El in Orange Village, Ohio; Temple Rodeph Torah in Marlboro, NJ; and Kesher Israel Congregation in West Chester, PA. Amongst other experience, Cantor Lawrence has worked with the Zamir Chorale of Boston and HaZamir Children's Choir Cleveland Chapter.

During his cantorial studies, Cantor Lawrence studied how previous composers of Jewish music have taken the musical tradition that they received from previous generations and blended it with contemporary musical styles; in keeping with this tradition, he has composed music mixing traditional music with contemporary styles for *Shabbat* worship.

Cantor Lawrence plays the piano, acoustic guitar, darkbouka, and frame drums.

In an interview on the Hebrew College website, Cantor Lawrence is asked what he hoped to bring from his cantorial education to his professional life. He answered:

I feel the most valuable piece of wisdom I've received from my education is the ever-present and important tension that exists in our liturgy between *keva* (that which is fixed/set) and *kavanah* (intention). To me, this pull between *keva* and *kavanah* is understanding how we can honor, cherish and utilize our vast received tradition while at the same time ensuring that what we do with our tradition is infused with meaning in today's world. I believe that both *keva* and *kavannah* have contributed, and continue to contribute, to Jewish continuity.

The 2022-23/5783 SZRS School Year begins on Sunday, September II

with weekly classes for students in pre-K/K* through 2nd grade and twice weekly classes for students in 3rd through 7th grade. (*children must be at least 4 years old to enter the weekly program).

Our *Kadima* program for children ages 0 - 4 (and at least one parent) got a makeover. We will now be having one program for babies ages 0 - 18 months and a second program for 18 mos + walkers, toddlers and pre-schoolers. They will be held at different hours on the same day so that families with multiple children can pick a program or stay all day.

Learn all about it during our Meet & Greet at 10:00 a.m. on **Sunday, September 11**. First day of classes will be **October 9**.

Our **Tichon** (high school) program for 8th-through 12th-graders will begin on **Sunday**, **October 23** and will meet for pizza and class every Sunday at noon.

*Madrichim-*in-Training (MiT) will begin for 8th-graders (and 9th-graders who did not take it last year) on **Sunday**, October 23 and will meet roughly twice monthly.


We will be back in person on the first day of religious school, Sunday, September 11. Please reach out to Patty in the office if you are looking for something special until then.

Please join us for a special presentation by Sophia Blumenthal* of **Dror Israel** (drorisrael.org). Dror Israel seeks to create a society of democracy, equality, and peace created through education and community, where all share responsibility, benefit from opportunity and realize their own potential in Israeli society.



Over the past decade, Dror Israel has been developing an educational pedagogy to integrate the Ethiopian–Israeli community and the story of their Aliyah into the Israeli and Zionist ethos. About five years ago, Dror Israel developed a unique guided mobile exhibit and accompanying educational session telling this amazing story, which has been run at schools, after–school programs, various educational workshops, at Sigd holiday celebrations, and more. After the controversies and clashes of recent years between the police and the Ethiopian–Israeli community, Dror Israel began developing a program together with the Israel Police using the mobile exhibit as a base, with the goal of improving relations between the community and law enforcement, helping police officers see community members in a different light, and addressing prejudices and racism.
