A Letter from Rabbi Bigman

Several times in the *Torah* we learn about the sabbatical year, the final year out of every seven where the land is to lie fallow:

Six years you shall sow your land and gather its yield, but in the seventh you shall let it rest and lie fallow. Let the needy among your people eat of it, and what they leave let the wild beasts eat. You shall do the same with your vineyards and your olive groves. [Exodus 23:10-11]

The sabbatical year is similarly mentioned in Leviticus where it is also noted that "the land shall have a sabbath of complete rest, a sabbath of Adonai." [25:4] In the fifteenth chapter of the Book of Deuteronomy, we learn that in addition to allowing the land to lie fallow in the seventh year, all outstanding debts are to be cancelled.

From these verses of *Torah* comes the modern idea of a sabbatical, as defined by Oxford Languages: "Sabbatical: a period of paid leave granted to a university teacher or other worker for study or travel, traditionally one year for every seven years worked."

Back in January-March 2014 I took the first sabbatical of my then 21-year career. Per my contract, I had been given 60 days of sabbatical. I added in unused vacation time and made my sabbatical into three months. Unfortunately, as many of you will remember, my sabbatical turned into medical leave as I fell on the ice in Cincinnati while studying at my alma mater, Hebrew Union College - Jewish Institute of Religion, and ended up shattering my kneecap!

Ilook back at the bulletin article and sermon that I wrote announcing my sabbatical and laugh when I get to the sentence "I also hope to spend some time with my sister and her family who live only 1 1/2 hours away from campus." I ended up not just spending "some time" with them, but rather an entire month as I lived with them as they nursed me back to health following my knee surgery!

In the normal course of a year, my responsibilities don't allow for me to take the full amount of vacation time to which I am contractually entitled, let alone months at a time for a sabbatical. I was very fortunate in 2014 to have many people fill in for my various responsibilities while I was on sabbatical / medical leave, especially **Cantor Schiffer** who led the majority of *Shabbat* services while I was out of town. So as not to be a burden to those who will fill in for me during worship, religious school responsibilities, *B'nei Mitzvah* tutoring, and more, I have chosen to take my upcoming sabbatical in increments. The first will be the month of November.

I am grateful to **Dr. Margot Valles** for teaching my high school class; **Rachel Minkin** for tutoring my *Bat Mitzvah* student; **Dr. Joanne Gilbert, Amy Shapiro, Susi Greiner, Rebecca Bahar-Cook,** and **Terry Selman** for leading *Shabbat* evening worship; and **Patty Warshaw** for fielding phone calls, e-mails, and more during my absence.*

In December I look forward to welcoming Rabbi Marla Feldman, executive director of the Women of Reform Judaism, to our *bimah* on Friday, December 2, as we celebrate Sisterhood *Shabbat*, and Dan Nichols, contemporary Jewish musician extraordinaire as we co-sponsor his concert with the Greater Lansing Jewish Federation on Saturday, December 3. What a great way it will be to return to the congregation by welcoming these two guests! I look forward to seeing you the first weekend of December for these extraordinary worship, learning, and musical opportunities!

*As of this writing, I am still looking for someone to lead a brief *Torah* study and to lead the Conservative *Shabbat* morning service on November 19. Please let me know if you are able to volunteer. Thank you!






