A Letter from Rabbi Bigman

As I write this in early December 2022, I have just learned about an anti-Semitic incident at my home congregation, Temple Beth El in Bloomfield Hills, a Detroit suburb. Thankfully, no one was physically injured. There have been many other incidents, as we know all too well, that have been more damaging throughout the years, yet this was still a significant incident in the Metro Detroit area.

Anti-Semitism has been around for a long time; we don't always see it, but anti-Semites have felt increasingly enabled to act on their hatred in recent years. While this is an issue for us as Jews, it should also be an issue for others because the hate that begins with Jews never ends with Jews. Any people who are considered "other" are threatened.

The late Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks, Chief Rabbi of the [Orthodox] United Hebrew Congregations of the United Kingdom from 1991 to 2013, a widely-respected commentator, noted years ago that:

Antisemitism is not about Jews. It is about anti-Semites. It is about people who cannot accept responsibility for their own failures and have instead to blame someone else...

First let me define the term. Antisemitism means denying the right of Jews to exist collectively as Jews with the same rights as everyone else. It takes different forms in different ages. In the Middle Ages, Jews were hated because of their religion. In the 19th and early 20th century they were hated because of their race. Today they are hated because of their nation-state, the state of Israel. [cited in "The Philadelphia Inquirer," published October 6, 2016]

As I noted in my Rosh HaShanah morning sermon on September 7, 2021:

We could spend hours upon hours, days upon days, weeks upon weeks, years upon years discussing anti-Semitism. We could discuss its historic religious basis when the early Church needed to show how it was better than the lews...

We could discuss specific stereotypes about Jews...

Frankly, I am less concerned today about the "why" behind anti-Semitism and more concerned about what we do about it.

So, how do we combat anti-Semitism? By acting as our religion commands us

"Love your neighbor as yourself." [Lev. 19:18]

"When a stranger resides with you in your land, you shall not wrong him. The stranger who resides with you shall be to you as one of your citizens; you shall love him as yourself, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt..." [Lev. 19:34] This is one of 36 times in the *Torah* where it tells us how to treat the stranger.

"It was told to you what is good and what God demands of you -- only doing justice and loving kindness and walking humbly with your God." [Micah 6:8]

<u>So, how do we combat anti-Semitism?</u> By participating in community interfaith activities. The Interfaith Clergy Association of Greater Lansing, of which I am the founder, and other organizations in our community sponsor interfaith programs and services, in which our Jewish community too rarely participates. It is often just me and less than a handful of others who represent our Jewish community...

<u>So, how do we combat anti-Semitism?</u> By continuing to invite school groups, college and university groups, and church groups to join us for worship. Groups meet with me prior to worship and then join us for the Friday night *Oneg*. The next time we have such a group with us, won't you ask them to join you at the *Oneg*? Surely we can skip sitting with our own friends and temple members occasionally in order to make our visitors feel welcome. It's a great way to learn more about them as they learn more about us.

<u>So, how do we combat anti-Semitism?</u> By being ambassadors when we're out in the world, acting appropriately when we are in public settings so that we don't give people the excuse to think of us negatively.

So, how do we combat anti-Semitism? By being proud of who we are...

Of course, we can't hope that anti-Semitism will magically go away; we have no control over that. One thing we do have in our control is how we act -- how we interact with others in personal and public settings. We must proudly wear our *kippot*, *Magein David* and *chai* necklaces, and *Chanukah* sweaters. We must be proud Jews and show and share our pride with others!

May this year of 2023 be the year in which anti-Semitism, racism, and all forms of bigotry cease. *Kein y'hi ratzon* -- May this be God's will.




