A Letter from Rabbi Bigman

When you think of the month of February, the first thing that probably comes to mind is Valentine's Day. This day is celebrated by many people. This month I'd like to share with you two important observances that are exclusive to us as Jews: Jewish Disability Awareness, Acceptance, and Inclusion Month and HIAS Refugee *Shabbat*.

Jewish Disability Awareness, Acceptance, and Inclusion Month (JDAIM) was established in 2009 and is observed each February. According to its co-founder, Shelley Christensen, JDAIM is "a unified effort among Jewish organizations worldwide to raise awareness and foster acceptance and inclusion of people with disabilities and mental health conditions and those who love them. JDAIM is a call to action for all of us to act in accordance with our Jewish values, honoring the gifts and strengths that we each possess."

The Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism (RAC) is a sponsor of **Jewish Disability Advocacy Day**. This year the online advocacy day is on Wednesday, February 15. You can learn more on the RAC's website or register for the advocacy day here: https://www.jewishtogether.org/JDAD-2023

Judaism teaches us that "You shall not insult the deaf, or place a stumbling block before the blind." [Lev. 19:14]. As the RAC notes: "Stumbling blocks come in many forms, unequal access or subpar educational and employment opportunities, lack of accessible housing and transportation, and discrimination and exclusion in both Jewish and secular spaces."

Also this month is the **Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society (HIAS) Refugee** *Shabbat*. For a number of years, Congregations Shaarey Zedek and Kehillat Israel have come together to mark Refugee *Shabbat*. (Please see page 3 for information about this year's collaboration on February 10 & 11.)

According to its website, HIAS is the world's oldest refugee agency, founded in 1902. HIAS' founding

"Represented a continuation of several predecessor organizations that had worked through the 1880s and 1890s to assist Jews fleeing pogroms in Russia and Eastern Europe...

Originally set up by Jews to help fellow Jews for reasons of religious imperative and communal solidarity, HIAS in the 2020s is a multi-continent, multi-pronged humanitarian aid and advocacy organization with thousands of employees dedicated to helping forcibly displaced persons around the world in keeping with the organization's Jewish ethical roots." 

USC Shoah Visual History Archive Workshop by MSU Libraries

Join this workshop for a demonstration of the new interface and sophisticated searching features of the USC Shoah Visual History Archive, a MSU Libraries' database containing over 55,000 video interviews with survivors and witnesses of genocide, as well as over 700,000 still images including photos and artifacts. New mapping features and testimony transcriptions in original languages will be shown. The archive includes the following events: The Armenian Genocide, the Nanjing Massacre, the Holocaust, the Cambodian Genocide, the Guatemalan Genocide, War and Genocide in Bosnia and Herzegovina, Genocide Against the Tutsi in Rwanda, Central African Republic Conflict, South Sudan Civil War, Anti-Rohingya Mass Violence, and Contemporary Antisemitism. The workshop is free of cost and open to all. The USC Shoah Visual History Archive at the MSU is supported by the Brill Family Endowment in Memory of Michael Brill.

Thank you to everyone who donated socks and mittens to keep our community warm this winter! Your thoughtful generosity goes a long way to helping our community


