A Letter from Rabbi Bigman

This month we are reading from the end of the Book of Leviticus and the beginning of the Book of Numbers in our annual *Torah* reading cycle. Much of Leviticus talks about a time that no longer exists: a time when our ancestors made offerings and sacrifices at the Tabernacle and later at the Temple in Jerusalem. When the Temple was destroyed for the second time in the year 70, by necessity, Judaism changed forever. We no longer worship God by making animal sacrifices and we no longer have priests as our ritual leaders.

The beginning of the final *parashah* in the Book of Leviticus says:

ָאָת־מִּצְוֹתַיִּ תִּשְׁמְרֹּוּ וַעֲשִׂיתָם אֹתָם: וְנָתַתִּי גִשְׁמֵיכֶם בְּעָתָּם וְנָתְנֵה הָאָרֶץ יְבוּלָהּ וְעֵץ הַשָּׂדֶה יִתֵּן פְּרְיוֹ:

If you follow My laws and faithfully observe My commandments, I will grant your rains in their season, so that the earth shall yield its produce and the trees of the field their fruit. [26:3-4]

This text, as with much of the last two chapters of Leviticus, uses the second person plural ("you all"), indicating that it is up to the entire group to obey God's commandments. If everyone came together to follow these teachings, there would be rain in its proper season and the land will provide the necessary food.

Similar words are found in Deuteronomy 11, which is also part of the traditional *V'ahavta* prayer. In Reform Judaism we have eliminated from the *V'ahavta* the section from Deuteronomy 11 as we don't believe it; nature doesn't work that way. Natural occurrences such as rain aren't dependent upon humans following laws.

Beliefs change. Rituals and practices change and develop according to the communities' needs. But what doesn't change is our need to come together, to comfort each other at difficult times and to celebrate with each other at happy times in our personal and communal lives; what doesn't change is our need to be part of communities that support us, that provide education for our children and ourselves, and that provide social opportunities for us.

What also doesn't change is that our communities need active participants: helping out in the religious school; planning Sisterhood events; delivering holiday packages to shut-ins; attending worship for *Shabbat* or to support our *B'nei Mitzvah*, Confirmation, and Graduation students; participating in Social Justice Task Force and *Tzedakah* Committee programs; or attending meetings of the congregation.

The weather won't change if we don't engage and support the congregation, but the congregation will.

SECURITY TRAINING

All are invited to attend two security sessions presented by Gary Sikorski, Director of Community Wide Security through The Jewish Federation of Metropolitan Detroit. Training will be held on Sunday, May 7 from 1:00-4:00 p.m. The training offered will be:

Active Assailant Response Training:

Options-based response training (Run/Hide/Fight) for situations involving an armed or violent intruder. Training will address preparing for and responding to crisis situations via an interactive presentation, walk-through drills, and hands-on response training. Participants can merely observe the hands-on portion or participate up to their level of comfort and ability.

Stop the Bleed Training:

During this training, you'll learn three quick techniques to help save a life before someone bleeds out: (1) How to apply a pressure bandage and/or pack a wound to control bleeding; (2) How to correctly apply a tourniquet; (3) How to apply a chest seal. A formal presentation is followed by hands-on practice of applying pressure bandages, packing a wound, using a tourniquet, and using a chest seal to stop bleeding.



Medical and Food Assistance Reductions



During the pandemic, the federal government declared a public health emergency (PHE). This required that Medicaid agencies continue health care coverage for those with current Medicaid coverage regardless of eligi- bility. The PHE is coming to end, and those with Medicaid, MI Child, and Healthy Michigan Plan coverage will be at risk of losing health care coverage. Additionally, the extra food assistance benefits which had been provided during the pandemic recently stopped, reducing SNAP benefits by approximately \$100 a month. In light of these changes, we're asking our Shaarey Zedek community to support our friends and neighbors who have been relying on these programs by donating over-the-counter medications and groceries to help offset the burden of this reduction. Please consider donating one or more of the following:
