# A Letter from Rabbi Bigman

---

## THE HOLIDAY PAR EXCELLENCE

As we reach the beginning of October / end of *Tishrei*, it may seem as if "the holidays" are over. We have celebrated *Rosh Hashanah* and observed *Yom Kippur*. However, five days after the conclusion of *Yom Kippur* begins what is known by the rabbis as "the holiday -- *he-chag*: *Sukkot*." *Sukkot* has many names, including "the time of our happiness or rejoicing (*z'man simchateinu*)."

Many of us are aware of the custom of building a *sukkah* and sleeping in it (or at least eating our meals in it) and waving the *lulav* and *etrog*. During worship we recite *Hallel*, the psalms of praise (Psalms 113-118). But did you know that on the *Shabbat* during *Sukkot* we read the Book of Ecclesiastes?

It's a difficult book, beginning with the words "Futility, utter futility, what do we gain by all of our toil under the sun?" and continuing with a very pessimistic view of life. But it also contains kernels of hope and wisdom.

We struggle and we despair at times in our lives, and there are times when we don't have the answers, yet Ecclesiastes reminds us that "for everything there is a season [and] a time for every experience under the sun." [3:1] There is a time for difficulties and a time for happiness: "Whatever it is in your power to do, do with all your might." [9:10]

Even if we don't understand the ways of the world, even if the world doesn't make sense to us, we can find purpose, happiness, and satisfaction in our lives. It may be difficult at times, but we can do it if we put our minds to it.

On *Yom Kippur* we may have struggled with the concept of God judging us and of God writing our names in the Book of Life or the Book of Death. We may have struggled with this theology which was meaningful to prior generations but may not hit the mark for us today. The writer of Ecclesiastes, traditionally believed to be King Solomon who wrote it in his old age, also struggled.



# *A Letter from Rabbi Bigman*

---

Rabbi Mari Chernow writes:

*Kohelet* [Ecclesiastes] teaches us to concentrate on the matters that we can control without losing sleep over those we can't. We are off the hook from trying to change the rhythm of the seas and the stars. We are off the hook from trying to find the fountain of youth. We are off the hook from trying to find the magic insight that is going to fix all of humanity and create a struggle-free life. Rather, we can live in the moment and infuse each breath with meaning. *Kohelet* says, "Go, eat your bread with enjoyment, and drink your wine with a merry heart, for Adonai has already approved what you do. Let your garments always be white, and do not let oil be lacking on your head. Enjoy life with the person you love, all the days of your life of breath.... Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with your might" (Ecclesiastes 9:7–10). In other words, live every single moment under the sun that God has given you.






