# A Letter from Rabbi Bigman

This is Rabbi Bigman's *D'var Torah* from our annual meeting on May 19:

The prophet Jeremiah was born in a town called Anatot not far from Jerusalem. He lived during difficult times and his prophecies reflect this as he rebukes the people who have gone astray. He began prophesying in the 13th year of the reign of King Josiah, who ruled the land of Judea in the seventh century BCE.

Jeremiah lived at the time of the destruction of the First Temple in 586 BCE and the exile of the Jewish people to Babylonia. He cried out against the people for their lack of faith and warned that they needed to mend their ways -- they needed to repent. Despite the desperate times during which Jeremiah lived, he always saw hope. He told the people that if they repented, if they had faith, God would bless them.

We see this in this week's *haftarah*, the *haftarah* for *Parashat B'har* (Leviticus 25:1-26:2), from the thirty-second chapter of the Book of Jeremiah. The incident described in this *haftarah* takes place around 588-587 BCE:

Jeremiah said: The word of God came to me:

Hanamel, the son of your uncle Shallum, will come to you and say, "Buy my land in Anatot, for you are next in succession to redeem it by purchase."

And just as God had said, my cousin Hanamel came to me in the prison compound and said to me, "Please buy my land in Anatot, in the territory of Benjamin; for the right of succession is yours, and you have the duty of redemption. Buy it." Then I knew that it was indeed the word of God.

So I bought the land in Anatot from my cousin Hanamel. I weighed out the money to him, seventeen shekels of silver. I wrote a deed, sealed it, and had it witnessed; and I weighed out the silver on a balance.

I took the deed of purchase, the sealed text and the open one according to rule and law, and gave the deed to Baruch son of Neriah son of Mahseiah in the presence of my kinsman Hanamel, of the witnesses who were named in the deed, and all the Judeans who were sitting in the prison compound. [32:6-12]



# A Letter from Rabbi Bigman

This is a remarkable story in that Jeremiah is in prison and yet follows the law, noted in this week's *Torah* portion, about purchasing the land of a kinsman in order to keep the land within the family. Here he is, in desperate straits to be sure, and he purchases land for his family! He may never again see the land, but he purchased it for future generations.

As we begin our annual meeting this year, Jeremiah's actions are a great lesson for us: We, like Jeremiah, must plan for future generations. Our own children and grandchildren may be grown and thus are not in need of our religious school, but we must provide religious school for the current and future generations. We may not need clergy for baby namings, *B'nei Mitzvah*, and weddings at this point in our lives, but we must provide these lifecycle connections for the current and future generations. We must continue to provide worship experiences, adult education, and holiday celebrations for this and future generations.

When we make decisions at today's meeting, when we are asked to provide financial resources, and when we are asked to participate in temple activities and programs this coming year, let us be like Jeremiah and say "yes" to our congregation's requests so that we may provide for generations to come.

Rabbi Bigman will assign *Torah* and *Haftarah* readers. If you would like to learn to read or chant *Torah* or *Haftarah* this year, please contact her at rabbibigman@shaareyzedek.com.

**Erev Rosh HaShanah**, **Wednesday**, **October 2:** sit on *bimah* (up to 4 people), light candles, English reading prior to the *Kiddush*, open the Ark for the singing of *Avinu Malkeinu*, open the Ark for the chanting of *Aleinu* 

**Rosh HaShanah**, **Thursday**, **October 3:** hakafah (carry the *Torah* scroll around the sanctuary before the reading), aliyot (3 people or couples), hagbahah (lifting the *Torah* scroll), g'lilah (dressing the *Torah* scroll)

**Rosh HaShanah**, **Friday**, **October 4**: *hakafah* (two people to carry the *Torah* scrolls around the sanctuary before and after the reading), *aliyot* (5 people or couples), *hagbahah* (two people to lift the two *Torah* scrolls), *g'lilah* (two people to dress the two *Torah* scrolls)

Kol Nidrei, Friday, October 11: our current and past presidents will participate in worship this evening

### Yom Kippur, Saturday, October 12:

<u>Morning Worship</u>: *hakafah* (carry the *Torah* scroll around the sanctuary before the reading), *aliyot* (3 people or couples), *hagbahah* (lifting the *Torah* scroll), *g'lilah* (dressing the *Torah* scroll)

<u>Afternoon (Minkhah) Worship</u>: aliyot (3 people or couples), hagbahah (lifting the *Torah* scroll), g'lilah (dressing the *Torah* scroll)

Concluding (Ne'ilah) Worship: open the Ark at the conclusion of worship

If you would like to **sound the shofar** at the children's or adult services on one or both days of **Rosh HaShanah** and/or at the concluding service on **Yom Kippur**, please contact Rabbi Bigman.

Our past presidents will continue to be honored during the Kol Nidrei service.

We will also need **ushers** for all of the worship services on the High Holy Days. Please contact David Ely to volunteer. Thank you for helping to make this year's celebration the most meaningful ever!





# Why Sisterhood?

What is Sisterhood you ask ... we are a group of women, or anyone that relates to the identity of being a woman. Our main purpose is to provide a fun nurturing environment to gather and enjoy the company of other Jewish women. We try to provide programs that support social, tikkun olam, or coming together in prayer. Sisterhood is here for you. How can we create a program that you just can't refuse? Listed below are a few things that Sisterhood does to keep Shaarey Zedek going.

# Religious School & Tuition

Did you know that Sisterhood provides a \$140 subsidy for every student that is enrolled in our school? Each year the money raised by Sisterhood supports our kids. This is for every student. It is our goal to support the religious school and families to the best of our abilities.

Sisterhood provides a gift to each student for *B'nei Mitzvah*, Confirmation, and Graduation.

# **Camp Scholarships**

Sisterhood offers camp scholarship to students that apply. Scholarships range from \$75 - \$150. They can be used for day camps like Camp Kehillat Zedek, overnight camps such as Camp Tavor, or teen leadership programs such as NFTY. Congregants support these scholarships by donating to Sisterhood, purchasing items from the gift shop, or supporting our annual bake sale around *Chanukah*.

# **Youth Group**

Sisterhood supports the Youth Group Director cost of \$3000 each year – GLTY (Greater Lansing Temple Youth). A great space for our middle and high school students to be with other Jewish kids and have some fun!

# **Gift Shop**

Sisterhood runs the gift shop that provides for all your Judaica needs. When you support the gift shop, 100% of the proceeds goes directly back to the synagogue.

When you join Sisterhood, your dues also extend to the Women of Reform Judaism. WRJ takes what we do even further. WRJ supports social action movements such as reproductive health, Women of the Wall, civil rights and much more. As a member of WRJ, you can use any of the programming and resources at WRJ.org
