A Letter from Rabbi Bigman

The holiday of *Sigd* is celebrated by Ethiopian Jews on the 29th of *Cheshvan* (November 30 this year). The Amharic word *Sigd* means "to prostrate oneself" or "to worship." The holiday falls 50 days after *Yom Kippur* and commemorates the acceptance of the *Torah*. In Ethiopia Jews pray in the direction of Jerusalem; they fast for the first part of the day and, following special Biblical readings done in the Ge'ez language, the *Kessim* (religious leaders) offer special blessings to the people. The entire community breaks their fast together and they express their hopes to go to Jerusalem. *Sigd* became a national holiday in Israel in 2008.

The history of the Ethiopian Jews is quite interesting. Some have suggested that when Moses and the Israelites left Egypt during the time of the Exodus, in about 1200 B.C.E., some of the people didn't make it across the Sea of Reeds. Instead they traveled to Ethiopia from Egypt. Others trace their history to the story of King Solomon and the Queen of Sheba around 900 B.C.E. (The area known as Sheba is believed by scholars to be in northern Ethiopia or southern Yemen.)

In I Kings 10:1-13, we have the story of Solomon and the queen meeting each other. The queen came to meet Solomon because she had heard of his wisdom; after he answered all of her questions, she gave Solomon many goods and he in turn gave the queen many goods. Some claim that the queen was pregnant when she went back to Sheba and gave birth to Menelik who would later become King of Ethiopia. The king came back to Israel to see his father, King Solomon, later in life. When he left Israel to return to Ethiopia, he brought many Israelites with him.

Others suggest that the Jews arrived in Ethiopia in the eighth century B.C.E. At that time two Israelite tribes lived in the southern kingdom, known as the Kingdom of Judah (or Judea). The remaining ten tribes lived in the northern kingdom, known as Israel. When the Assyrians invaded the north, the ten tribes were lost to us. Some believe that the members of the tribe of *Dan* escaped from the Assyrians and migrated to Ethiopia.

However the Jews of Ethiopia got there, they lived for 2,000 years not knowing that there were other Jews in the world. They lived in the region of Gondar, up in the mountains, totally removed from the rest of the world. They called themselves the *Beta Israel* (House of Israel).

During the 1980s, with famine, disease, and oppression rampant in Ethiopia, thousands of Jews fled. About 4,000 died in their attempt to get to Israel. In 1984-1985, Operation Moses rescued 8,000 Jews and brought them to Israel. In 1991, during Operation Solomon, over 14,000 *Beta Israel* were flown out of Ethiopia to Israel in 1 1/2 days!

Ethiopian Jews are in need of our help. Here are two organizations that specifically work with Ethiopian Jews, both those still remaining in Ethiopia and those in Israel:

- 1. **The North American Conference on Ethiopian Jewry (www.nacoej.org)** is a non-profit organization founded in 1982 with four mandates:
 - To help Ethiopian Jews survive in Ethiopia.
 - To assist each Ethiopian Jew in reaching Israel.
 - To aid in the absorption of Ethiopian Jews into Israeli society.
 - To preserve the unique and ancient culture of Jews of Ethiopian descent.
- 2. **English B'Yachad / Skilled Volunteers for Israel** (https://www.skillvolunteerisrael.org/) is an organization that enhances the lives of young adults from less-advantaged Israeli communities (primarily Ethiopian) by volunteering online to help them with conversational English.
