A Letter from Rabbi Bigman

WELCOMING THE STRANGER **How the Jewish Community Must Support Refugees in Lansing**

Thirty-six is an important number in Judaism: 2 x 18. With the number 18 representing life (*chai*), the number 36 represents "double life." So it is significant that 36 times in the *Torah* we learn how to treat the stranger, the one who resides in our land. Why must we do so? Because we know what it was like to be strangers:

Exodus 23:9 "You shall not oppress a stranger, for you know the feelings of the stranger, having yourselves been strangers in the land of Egypt."

Leviticus 19:33-34 "When a stranger resides with you in your land, you shall not wrong him. The stranger who resides with you shall be to you as one of your citizens; you shall love him as yourself, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt."

Rabbi Yossi Sapirman, formerly of Beth Torah Congregation in Toronto, Ontario, Canada notes that

The *Torah* of Moses is a story of immigration. From the earliest human movement as refugees from Eden to the final eulogy of Moses in which the Exodus is noted as the highpoint of his life's work, biblical humanity tells of people unsettled, unarrived and tenuously connected to "home." [<https://journeys.uscj.org/strangers-in-land-of-egypt/>]

Judaism is quite clear: We are called upon to protect the stranger/newcomer who resides with us, which today includes refugees. Given the government's cutbacks, the situation today is very difficult. Refugee Services, part of Catholic Charities of Ingham, Eaton & Clinton Counties, shares that funds previously were available to provide newcomer rental assistance up to \$600 per family per month for one year. The family covered the remainder. These funds are no longer available.

The Interfaith Clergy Association of Greater Lansing is planning a fundraiser to help subsidize rent; however, this fundraiser won't be held until April (date to be determined). In the meantime, funds are desperately needed. Please join me in this *mitzvah*!

So please ask yourself: "Am I giving all that I can to my congregation?" Perhaps you have been intending to make a donation, but life just got in the way. Maybe you would like to honor someone by donating to a particular fund. Please do everything you are able to help our congregation so that we can continue to thrive and provide all that you need and expect.

HONORING ESTHER MORRISON



Our community has the rare honor of celebrating a truly remarkable milestone. On January 4, 2026, Esther Morrison will turn 107 years old—a blessing not only in years, but in the extraordinary life, spirit, and legacy that accompany them.

Born in Detroit in 1919, Esther's life story reflects strength, resilience, love, and unwavering dedication to Jewish life. Esther was accepted to the University of Illinois and had even joined a sorority there, but a transferred school credit prevented her attendance. Instead, she carved her own meaningful path. Earlier in life she worked as a bookkeeper, and after her marriage devoted herself completely to volunteerism and community service.

Esther married Justin Morrison, the love of her life, and together they shared 52½ beautiful years. They built a loving family that remains her greatest joy—three children, six grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren, all of whom adore her and cherish her wisdom, warmth, and humor.

In 1940, Esther and Justin made Shaarey Zedek their spiritual home, and that same year Esther joined Sisterhood, where she became a pillar of commitment and leadership. She served as Vice President of Sisterhood, always ready to step forward when needed. Known for rolling up her sleeves and getting involved, Esther helped each year with the beloved Smorgasbord, chaired the Sunday School program, and proudly served as the first President of Women's *B'nai B'rith* in Lansing—an accomplishment that helped secure a house for MSU Hillel, strengthening Jewish student life for generations to come.

To Esther, Sisterhood mattered deeply—not only as part of the heart of Shaarey Zedek, but because its support made Sunday School education possible, helping ensure the continuity of Jewish learning and tradition.

Today, at nearly 107, Esther continues to be thought of with love, admiration, and gratitude—especially from her Shaarey Zedek family in East Lansing. She remains a source of inspiration through her grace, dedication, and the beautiful life of service she has led.

Please join us in wishing *Mazal Tov* to Esther Morrison on her 107th birthday. May she continue to be blessed with good health, joy, and the warmth of the family and community who love her so dearly.


